Important Information for Parents/Guardians

Enrollment

Please refer to the attached flyers for each class for enrollment and payment instructions. If you enroll for a class that becomes full, or if a class is canceled due to insufficient enrollment, you will be notified, and your payment will be returned.

There are no classes on days when there is no school.

Scholarships

The PTA offers scholarships for all classes. To apply for a PTA scholarship for your child, fill out the *PTA Scholarship Application Form*. Be sure to indicate on the form which **class, time, and day** you are interested in. You will be contacted with the status of your scholarship application before the first day of the class in which you want to enroll. Scholarships are given to qualified applicants on a first-come first-served basis.

Student Supervision & Pick-Up Policy

Parents/guardians should ensure that students are either enrolled in Adventure Time (AT), Learning Without Limits, or supervised by an adult while on school premises before and after after-school enrichment classes. Neither the school nor the PTA is responsible for your children at these times.

- Students enrolled in AT: AT will escort children to and from after-school enrichment classes.
- Students enrolled in Learning without Limits: parents/guardians should inform Learning without Limits of any after-school enrichment classes their children are enrolled in.

Student Behavior

Please make sure your child knows the time and place of their enrichment classes. It is important that students be on their best behavior on the way to and from classes as well as *during* the class. Children with behavior problems may not be allowed to continue attending the class.
